My Experience at the Pentagon on 9/11

John is one of our own & has graciously offered to share his experiences while working at the Pentagon on 11 September 2001. Here is a little bit about John:

A native of Chattanooga, Tennessee, John was graduated from the United States Military Academy and commissioned in the Field Artillery on 9 June 1965. After a series of company level assignments in the United States and Germany, coupled with combat duty with the 1st Cavalry Division in the Republic of Vietnam, he attended the University of Virginia and was awarded a Master of Science in physics in 1971, after which he served as an instructor and assistant professor in the Department of Physics at West Point for three years. Field grade duties included a series of command and operational staff positions in the United States, Turkey, and Germany, followed by an assignment to the Pentagon as the Executive Officer to the Chief of Staff of the Army. In 1990 John was promoted to brigadier general and stationed at Fort Carson, Colorado, as the Assistant Division Commander for Support of the 4th Infantry Division (Mechanized). After command of Joint Task Force Six at Fort Bliss, Texas, in 1991-93, he was promoted to major general and assigned

to senior staff and command at Fort McPherson, Georgia, and Fort Bragg, North Carolina. John commanded Fort Carson from 1996 to 1997, and in October 1997 he was promoted to lieutenant general and assigned as the Chief of Staff and Deputy Commanding General of United States Army Forces Command. From August 1999 until his retirement in January 2002, John was Director of the Army Staff in the Pentagon. His awards include the Distinguished Service Medal, two Defense Superior Service Medals, five Legions of Merit, the Distinguished Flying Cross, two Bronze Star Medals (one with "V" Device), four Meritorious Service Medals, 19 Air Medals, and two Army Commendation Medals. Following his retirement from the Army, John joined Bechtel National, Inc. (BNI) in February 2002 and served as the Manager of Strategic Programs and Homeland Security until deploying to Iraq with BNI in April 2003. During his tour with the Iraq Infrastructure Reconstruction Program, John was initially the Manager of Liaison and Security Services and then the Deputy Program Manager for the project until his return to the United States in September 2004. After a six-month stint as a capture manager for a major DoD project, in April 2005 John became the President and Program Manager of Kwajalein Ranges Services, LLC, which provides space operations, logistical, and community services support to the U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll/Ronald Reagan Ballistic Missile Defense Test Site. John returned from Kwajalein in July 2007 and became the Senior Manager of Defense & Space Programs. In June 2011 John was assigned as the Program Manager of the Cooperative Threat Reduction Program until his retirement from BNI in June 2012. John and his wife. Karen, have been married for over 59 years and have one daughter, two sons, eight grandchildren, and five great grandchildren. Their youngest child is an Army colonel who has had five combat tours of duty in Iraq and Afghanistan and is currently assigned as the commander of the 1st Infantry Division Artillery at Fort Riley, Kansas.

As always, I'm sad to miss a meeting. I so enjoy getting to visit with everyone & play catch up on each other's adventures. I am especially sorry that I will not get to hear LTG Pickler's talk on his experiences while at the Pentagon on 11 September 2001.

There are times in our lives when a major event happened & what we were doing sticks with us for the rest of our lives. I was in Mrs. Beesley's 5th grade class at McClain School in Lebanon on 22 November 1963 when President Kennedy was shot & killed. On 20 July 1969, I was at my grandfather's home in Nolensville with my family & we watched the first moon landing & walk.

11 September 2001, I was in my office at the Tennessee Army National Guard Armory on Sidco Drive, working at my desk. A coworker came in & told me to turn the

TV on. He said, "You won't believe what some idiot has just done! He's flown into one of the twin towers in New York!" Quickly I turned on the TV. The three of us in the office watched, stunned into silence, at we saw first one building burning, then the second plane flying into the towers. My first thought was how could a trained pilot not see those two buildings sticking up in the air. As the story unfolded, I still couldn't get my hands around what had happened. Several of us had a planned trip to D.C. in a couple of weeks & we had a tour of Air Force Two laid on. I wondered out loud if this would affect that trip!

I remember a couple of days later, we had a voluntary assembly in the drill hall. One of our Soldiers who was also a minister spoke. We prayed for those lost & our country, & we played Lee Greenwood's song "God Bless the USA". When it came to the part where he sang "I proudly stand up", everyone in that assembly stood up without any prompting or hesitation. To this day, I still get tears in my eyes, a lump in my throat, & chills just thinking about it.

We didn't know on that day the impact that event would have on our country, our world, & each of us. I pray we, as a nation, never have to go through any of that ever again.

God Bless the USA!


August Service Project

Member Spotlight

CPT Olen Charles Akins, USN (Ret)



My name is Olen Charles Akins. I was raised in the Amarillo, Texas area, graduating from a small town, Happy High School in 1954. I joined the navy shortly afterward. I was promoted very rapidly and after four years, I got out as an E-6. I attended Texas Tech for two years before my wife was in the family way. My navy vocation was critical, and they offered me a return at the E-6 rating. I accepted and remained in the navy for an additional 36 years. I served as a Chief Petty Officer, Warrant and Chief Warrant before being demoted to Ensign. My career path was aviation maintenance management. I served at the squadron, wing and carrier levels. I also did an exchange tour of two years with the Australian Navy and two tours in Japan. The last one being mostly deployed to different carriers off the coast of Vietnam, with some time in DaNang. My most enjoyable experience was the carrier air wing maintenance billet. Coordination of maintenance of approximately 85 aircraft with the required movement for flyable versus heavy maintenance is an around the clock evolution. My career ending assignment was the Command billet for all aircraft maintenance civilian contracts maintaining pilot and "back

seaters" training aircraft for Chief Of Naval Air Training. I was concurrently the Assistant Chief of Staff for Maintenance and Material. Somewhere during my career I finished my degree with the University of New York by extension. It's fair to tell that I'm an over achiever. My goal was to retire at 20 years and close to the top of the enlisted ranks, however I certainly agree that O-6 is much better. I am reasonably confident that my career was no different from yours in that it passed so quickly. Sure there were hard times, but would you do it again, absolutely. If that wasn't true, none of us would be MOAA members. continuing the camaraderie. Very respectfully submitted, Charlie
